Because the Taliban rulers of Afghanistan impose strict limitations on women's freedom and behavior, eleven-year-old Parvana must disguise herself as a boy to help her family survive after her father's arrest. Start of a trilogy.

In a future where humans despise clones, Matt enjoys special status as the young clone of El Patron, the 142-year-old leader of a corrupt drug empire nestled between Mexico and the United States.

Twelve-year-old Cass meets her new African-American neighbor, Jemmie, and despite their families' prejudices, they build a friendship around their mutual talent for running and a pact to read Jane Eyre.

After injuring his hand, a silversmith's apprentice in Boston becomes a messenger for the Sons of Liberty in the days before the American Revolution.

**Frank, Anne**                                 **Anne Frank: The Diary of a Young Girl**                                 **Autobiography**  
A teenage Jewish girl describes both the joys and torments of daily life, as well as typical adolescent thoughts, throughout two years spent in hiding with her family during the Nazi occupation of Holland.

**Funke, Cornelia**                                 **The Thief Lord**                                 **Realistic Fiction/ Adventure**  
Orphaned brothers Prosper and Bo, having run away from their aunt and uncle, hide out in Venice where they fall in with the Thief Lord, a thirteen-year-old boy who leads a crime ring of street children.

**Gilbreth, Frank B.**                                 **Cheaper by the Dozen**                                 **Autobiography**  
Two siblings in the Gilbreth clan look at the lives of their efficiency expert parents, and share the adventures of the couple raising twelve children. Sequel is Belles on Their Toes.

**Greene, Bette**                                 **Summer of My German Soldier**                                 **Historical Fiction**  
When German prisoners of war are brought to her Arkansas town during World War II, twelve-year-old Patty, a Jewish girl, befriends one of them and must deal with the consequences of that friendship. Sequel is Morning is a Long Time Coming.

**Haddix, Margaret Peterson**                                 **Among the Hidden**                                 **Science Fiction/Adventure**  
In a future where laws limit a family to only two children, Luke has lived all his twelve years in isolation and fear on his family's farm, until another "third" convinces him that the government is wrong. Start of the **Shadow Children series**.

**Haddix, Margaret Peterson**                                 **Don't You Dare Read This, Mrs. Dunphrey**                                 **Realistic Fiction/Adventure**  
In the journal she is keeping for English class, sixteen-year-old Tish chronicles the changes in her life when her abusive father abandons her and her brother, and her mother follows him.

**Haddix, Margaret Peterson**                                 **Turnabout**                                 **Science Fiction**  
Two teenage participants face serious consequences when they refuse to continue with the treatments in Project Turnabout, a scientific experiment to stop the aging process, after things start going wrong.

**Hamilton, Bethany**                                 **Soul Surfer: True Story of Faith, Family...**                                 **Autobiography**  
Bethany Hamilton shares the story of her lifelong love of surfing, and tells how she was able to recover and return to competition with the help of her family, friends, and faith after losing her arm in a shark attack at the age of thirteen.

**Hannigan, Katherine**                                 **Ida B: and Her Plans to Maximize Fun...**                                 **Realistic Fiction**  
Fourth-grader Ida B spends happy hours being home-schooled and playing in her family's apple orchard, until her mother becomes ill, her parents must sell part of the orchard, and she goes to public school.

**Hautzig, Esther**                                 **The Endless Steppe: Growing Up in Siberia**                                 **Autobiography**  
The author tells of her trials of five years of hardship in Poland during World War II, when she was eleven years old and exiled to Siberia with her family.

During a summer, twelve-year-old Martha gains perspective on the death of a classmate, on her relationship with her grandmother, on her feelings for an older boy, and on her plans to be a writer.

**Hesse, Karen**                                 **Phoenix Rising**                                 **Realistic Fiction**  
Thirteen-year-old Nyle learns about relationships and death when fifteen-year-old Ezra, who was exposed to radiation leaked from a nearby nuclear plant, comes to stay at her grandmother's farmhouse.

**Hesse, Karen**                                 **The Music of Dolphins**                                 **Realistic Fiction**

**Howe, Norma**                                **The Adventures of Blue Avenger**                                **Fantasy/Comedy**  
On his sixteenth birthday, David Schumacher decides--or does he--to change his name to Blue Avenger, hoping to find a way to make a difference in his Oakland neighborhood and in the world.

**Hughes, Monica**                                **Invitation to the Game**                                **Science Fiction**  
After high school in the highly robotic society of 2154, Lisse and seven friends resign themselves to a boring existence in their "Designated Area" until the government invites them to play the Game.

Start of a series.

The adventures of a young boy raised by the animals in an Indian jungle.

Gene Forrester looks back fifteen years to a World War II year in which he and his best friend Phineas were roommates in a New Hampshire boarding school.

**Korman, Gordon**                                **No More Dead Dogs**                                **Realistic Fiction/Humor**  
Eighth-grade football hero Wallace Wallace is sentenced to detention attending rehearsals of the school play where, in spite of himself, he becomes wrapped up in the production.

Her father's involvement with the Kurdish resistance movement in Iraq forces thirteen-year-old Tara to flee with her family over the border into Iran, where they face an unknown future.

Shipwrecked after a vicious storm, fourteen-year-old John Spencer attempts to save his father and himself while also dealing with an evil secret about the Cornish coastal town where they are stranded.

**Levine, Gail Carson**                                **The Two Princesses of Bamarre**                                **Fantasy**  
With her adventurous sister, Meryl, suffering from the Grey death, meek and timid Princess Addie sets out to find a cure.

**Lipsyte, Robert**                                **The Contender**                                **Sports/Realistic Fiction**  
After a successful start in a boxing career, a Harlem high school dropout decides that competing in the ring isn't enough of life and resolves to aim for different goals.

**Lisle, Janet Taylor**                                **The Art of Keeping Cool**                                **Historical Fiction**  
In 1942, Robert and his cousin Elliot uncover long-hidden family secrets and they also become involved with a German artist who is suspected of being a spy.

**Lowry, Lois**                                **The Giver**                                **Science Fiction/ Newbery**  
Given his lifetime assignment, Jonas becomes the receiver of memories shared by only one other in his community and discovers the terrible truth about the society in which he lives.

Thirteen-year-old Martin, a new student at an alternative school for misfits and problem students, falls in with a group of boys with psychic powers and discovers something surprising about himself. Sequel is True Talents.

While navigating his first year of high school and awaiting the birth of his new baby brother, Scott loses old friends and gains some unlikely new ones as he hones his skills as a writer.

After he is cut from his basketball team--the team that his father once led to national prominence--twelve-year-old Danny Walker forms his own team of cast-offs that might have a shot at victory. Sequel is Summer Ball.

A fictionalized version of the life of Harriet Jacobs, told in the form of letters that she might have written during her slavery in North Carolina and as she prepared for escape to the North in 1842.

A battered child learns to embrace life when he is adopted by an old man in the English countryside during World War II.

Thirteen-year-old Mia sees a special color with every letter, number, and sound; she keeps this a secret until she is overwhelmed by school, changing relationships, and the death of her beloved cat, Mango.

Sixteen-year-old "Slam" Harris is counting on his noteworthy basketball talents to get him out of the inner city and give him a chance to succeed in life, but his coach sees things differently.

During World War II a Jewish boy is left on his own for months in a ruined house in the Warsaw Ghetto, where he must learn all the tricks of survival under constantly life-threatening conditions.

**Park, Linda Sue**                            **When My Name Was Keoko**                            **Historical Fiction**  
With national pride and occasional fear, a brother and sister face the increasingly oppressive occupation of Korea by Japan during World War II, which threatens to suppress Korean culture entirely.

**Patterson, James**                            **Maximum Ride: The Angel Experiment**                            **Science Fiction/Adventure**  
After the mutant Erasers abduct members of their group, the "birdkids," who are the result of genetic experimentation, take off in pursuit and find themselves struggling to understand their own origins and purpose. Start of a series.

**Paulsen, Gary**                            **Dogsong**                            **Adventure**  
A fourteen-year-old Eskimo boy undertakes the Iditarod race, a 1400-mile journey by dog sled across ice, tundra, and mountains seeking his own "song" of himself.

**Paulsen, Gary**                            **My Life in Dog Years**                            **Autobiography**  
The author describes how dogs have impacted his life from childhood through the present day, recounting the stories of the dogs in his life, including Cookie, who saved his life.

**Perkins, Lynne Rae**                            **All Alone in the Universe**                            **Realistic Fiction**  
Debbie is dismayed when her best friend Maureen starts spending time with ordinary, boring Glenna. Sequel is Criss Cross, Newbery Medal Winner, 2006.

**Philbrick, Rodman**                            **Freak the Mighty**                            **Realistic Fiction**  
Learning disabled Max and his new friend Freak, whose birth defect has affected his body but not his brilliant mind, are eighth graders who find that when they combine forces they make a powerful team. Sequel is Max the Mighty.

**Pierce, Tamora**                            **Sandry's Book (Circle of Magic)**                            **Fantasy**  
Four young misfits find themselves living in a strictly disciplined temple community where they become friends while also learning to do crafts and to use their powers, especially magic. Start of a series

**Pullman, Philip**                            **Ruby in the Smoke**                            **Mystery**  
In nineteenth-century London, sixteen-year-old Sally, a recent orphan, becomes involved in a deadly search for a mysterious ruby. Start of a series.
